


Figure one shows that, although the number of accidents increased over the years, the mortality rate decreased.






Figure one. Display of accidents and fatalities by time intervals (a) and display of fatalities expressed in percentages (b) for all conveyors.

Common Hazards Associated With Use of Conveyor Belts


Here are some hazards most likely to occur when a conveyor system is in operation.





1. Use Safety Devices

2. Use Personal Protective Equipment
